





- Key Elements
 - Safety and Education-Two Red Stripes leaning Forward
 - Boating Symbolized as Ship's Wheel, both Power and Sail
 - Lake Candlewood a Floating Wooden Candlestick Holder carrying a Lighted Candle
 - Patriotism American Red, White And Blue Colors
- Burgee was approved by USPS Governing Board on May 25, 1964 at the Hotel Aster, NYC



- Membership Up To 160




On May 14th we finished our 2nd Spring Public Boating Class and welcomed a few new members. Thanks, to all who helped with the Spring classes.


